On October 24, 2011, 23 demonstrators were arrested outside a Chase Bank when they blocked the entrance and refused access to bank customers.

On October 27, 2011, an Occupy Dallas participant was arrested and charged with Failure to Register as a Sex Offender and Sexual Assault of a Child after allegedly having sex with a 14 year old runaway at the Occupy Dallas encampment on October 22.

On November 2, 2011, several individuals who were staying at the encampment became involved in argument with members of the media who were attempting to do a live broadcast from the Occupy Dallas encampment. One of the Occupy Dallas members went so far as to unplug the lights used by the news crew.

On November 4, 2011, an Occupy Dallas participant attempted to block the path of a City of Dallas Parking Enforcement Officer who was issuing citations in the south parking lot of City Hall.

On November 12, 2011, police were called to the Occupy Dallas encampment regarding a man attempting to choke another person. While questioning the suspect, the suspect began talking about "mind domination" and told officers he was in possession of radioactive material that needed to be taken to NASA. The man was charged with the assault and taken in for mental evaluation.

On November 14, 2011, a man staying at the Occupy Dallas camp site was taken into custody for a mental evaluation after officers determined he may be a danger to himself or others. Two other participants in Occupy Dallas later reported the man had threatened to kill them while brandishing a knife on November 13th. As a result, two Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon offenses were made.

On November 14, 2011, the man taken into custody for a mental evaluation earlier that day returned to the Occupy Dallas camp. Other residents of the camp refused the man access to the camp and his personal items. The confrontation resulted in three misdemeanor "C" assault citations being issued.

On November 15, 2011, two members of Occupy Dallas were discussing politics in the 2800 block of Commerce when another person associated with the Occupy Dallas movement interjected himself into the conversation. The third man became angry and assaulted the other two men. A class "C" assault offense and a class "A" assault offense were filed.

On November 2, 2011, an individual involved in the Occupy Dallas was arrested adjacent to the encampment for public intoxication. During the booking

procedure, the man was found to be in possession of a white powdery substance field tested to be cocaine.

On November 4, 2011, a nine-month old child was taken into protective custody by Child Protective Services after the parents had been living with the child at the Occupy Dallas encampment.

On November 8, 2011, a female was arrested on a Mental Illness Emergency Detention Warrant.

On November 13, 2011, a female demonstrator was observed urinating in front of entry doors to City Hall.

The Crisis Intervention Team, which has attempted to ensure the mental and physical needs of the people staying at the Occupy Dallas encampment are met, have requested police officers accompany them on all future visits due to personal safety concerns.

List of Violations of the Settlement Agreement and City Ordinances

- Weapons have been maintained on the Subject Property.
- Fuel has been stored on the Subject Property.
- Persons, tents and portable generators have been maintained within the fenced-in areas.
- Space heaters and candles have been used in the tents.
- Occupy Dallas participants have been attempting to meet with City Officials and staff in City Hall in numbers greater than four without making an appointment.
- Semi-permanent signs and structures have been maintained on the Subject Property.
- There has been cooking on the Subject Property.
- Trash has not been removed from the site on a daily basis.
- Dogs have been improperly tethered on the site.
- Portable generators have not been maintained on impervious surfaces.
- Public urination.
